## Research In Progress

*Sexual Harassment in the Military: Service Differences in Rates and Causes of Sexual Harassment.* (with Mindy Bergman)

Utilizing the *Status of the Armed Forces Survey 2002*, we examine variation in rates of sexual harassment across the services (Army, Navy, Air Force, Marine Corps, and Coast Guard) to determine how differing organizational features, such as gender ratio, policies, and policy implementation, affect those rates.

*Is Terrorism a Successful Strategy? Fruitful and Fruitless Attempts*

Applying social movement theories, I show historically when and why terrorism has been a successful strategy and when and why terrorism has been unsuccessful. Contributing to the discussion of why social movement organizations choose violence as a tactic, I address the possible fruitfulness and fruitlessness of terrorism as a strategy.
